

MGE UPS Systems v. GE Consumer and Industrial Inc.

Facts:

(5th Cir.)

- MGE: uninterruptable power supply (UPS) device manufacturer
- PMI: GE-owned co subcontracted with MGE to service MGE devices
- PMI obtained software to manage MGE's power supply w/out MGE's permission and allegedly circumvented MGE's security features

Holding:

- July opinion: created circuit split; held DMCA does not create liability for users who bypass a technological protection measure preventing a user from accessing a work to simply view it or use it within fair use
- September substitute opinion: circuit split gone court entirely withdrew discussion of whether a copyright violation is a prerequisite for a DMCA violation

U.S. v. ASCAP (2nd Cir.)

Facts:

- Yahoo! And RealNetworks offered music online via digital download; both companies had ASCAP "blanket licenses"
- ASCAP sued arguing companies owed additional license fees because digital downloads also a "public performance"

Holding:

A download distinguishable from an online stream and is not a "public performance" under U.S. copyright law


Perfect 10 v. Google (C.D. Cal.)

Facts:

- 2004: adult entertainment co/frequent litigator sued Google alleged direct and secondary copyright infringement because Google linked to websites hosting Perfect 10's copyrighted photos
- 2007: 9th Circuit reversed preliminary injunction in favor of Perfect 10 on direct infringement claims; case sent back to district court for secondary infringement claims


Holding:

- Summary judgment for Google on most claims: Perfect 10 failed to provide Google with sufficient DMCA notice and takedown letters.
 - DMCA notices must identify with specificity infringed works and location of the infringing work

All Eyes on France as Officials Enforce New Antipiracy Law

PARIS—France's new Internet piracy police has been scouring the Web this month for people illegally downloading films and music and sending hundreds of warning emails to suspected intellectual property thieves.

The implementation of France's new antipiracy law—which is one of the first in the world, along with similar legislation in South Korea, Taiwan and Britain—is considered a litmus test by other nations hoping to crack down on intellectual property theft.
